Class Creation for Next Year

Every year at the end of summer, there's an annual ritual of excitement and nervous anticipation when families find out whose class the kids will be in and which classmates they'll be joining. Our staff takes the process of creating classes very carefully, and it's one of the most challenging puzzles for us at the end of every school year.

As we have in the past, we'll be asking students in grade 2 and upward to share the names of a couple "good learning partner" friends who help them to be their best selves as learners and

citizens. We also do our best to make it very clear that we can't guarantee every child will get the friends they asked for. That's because our Tetris puzzle of class creation has many factors and priorities. Here are the main things we take into account and attempt to balance:



- Class complexity. Every grade has a wide range of learning needs, "energy levels," and social/emotional factors. Balancing these across classes is one of our highest priorities. We want students who need that extra attention and support to have as much of it as possible in all of a grade's classes.
- 2. Learning needs. We try to put students together who will be positive learning influences on one another. Sometimes that also means putting students who didn't have the best influence on one another in different classes. And sometimes those are kids who requested one another as friends.
- 3. Friendships & peer culture. We do want students to feel like they're starting their year with some familiar faces and a sense of belonging. However, we also know that friendships shift every year and new friends will be made.
- 4. Gender. It's certainly not the most important piece, but we do try to make sure there's a gender balance in each class.

As we approach the end of a year we get this question a lot: "Can I make a request for next year?" Yes you can, but please bear in mind: we can't make promises.

Can I request certain peers to be in my child's class next year? Yes. Please email your child's teacher.

Can I request certain peers to not be in my child's class next year: Yes. Please email the assistant principal for next year's grade (<u>Kirsty Reade</u> – K-4, <u>Jason Ness</u> – 5-8).

Can I request a particular teacher: Yes, but please don't get your hopes up. We make the classes before we assign the teachers to them. If families with kids in the same class request different teachers, unfortunately someone is going to be disappointed. Please email the assistant principal for next year's grade (<u>Kirsty Reade</u> – K-4, <u>Jason Ness</u> – 5-8).

We try to meet as many requests as we can, but sometimes the puzzle just can't fit the way everyone wants. We make no promises, but we'll do our best.

Class creation will begin before the end of May, so if you have asks, please make them in the next couple weeks. August/September requests are much more difficult to accommodate.


