D. Regular Agenda:

1. Rockyview School Division Update (Fiona Gilbert)

- School fees
 - a. We will get them from across the division
 - b. Then go forward to the board for approval
 - Looking to balance opportunities for students but want to minimize the impact on families
 - d. The board will be looking at transportation fees
 - e. Budget committee meets next week
- Provincial Budget
 - a. About 6 million increase most with enrollment growth, and small inflation increase to some of the smaller grants
 - b. New funding model
 - c. Capital announcement
 - 2 schools have been announced off the capital plan for RVS
 - School in Airdrie and Chestermere announced
 - Next projects to come up in the capital plan
 - i. High School in Cochrane
 - ii. K-8 Heartland
 - Sept 2028 for the Rivercrest school still projected; being built as a K-8 but the model can adjust

- i. 12 months before the school opens, then conversations about rezoning occurs
- d. 7.5 million just announced for the younger learners. We get the money now and it has to be used in the next two months, so that makes it really tricky

- Fireside budget
 - a. Opens on Monday, and we will start looking at allocating money
 - b. 895 is our projection right now
 - c. We will have 3 kinder classes as of right now. Shaun will move into grade one, and Leslie Hall will move to do ½ Kinder and ½ literacy
 - o If numbers balloon over the summer, we will make changes
 - 2 AM and 1 PM
 - d. Pretty much the same otherwise...4 classes of each grade all the way up
 - e. Staffing decided
 - All permanent teachers must be placed first on a staff, and that is part because Shaun will move up
- School Fees
 - a. Rules
 - No increase to an option fee by \$10 or 5%
 - No blanket fee increases
 - All cost charged must be for resources, and can be used towards other school fees
 - End of each year the revenue must be returned back to families
 - b. Increased fees
 - Activity fee charged per grade following are the increases
 - i. Grade 2 \$90 to \$100
 - ii. Grade 4 \$104 to \$114
 - iii. Grade 7 \$200 to \$210

- iv. Kinder \$55 to \$65
- v. Increasing ski field trip - successful this year and want to continue. It was expensive even with the deal so - \$100 to \$110
 - i. Grade 4s will go to COP
 - ii. Grades 5 & 6 will go to Nakiska still
 - iii. We had teachers really step up and made the
- Options
 - i. Sculpting \$15 to 20
 - ii. Shop \$21to 25
 - iii. Cosmo \$23 to 30
 - iv. Fiber arts \$21 to 25
 - v. Foods \$22 30
 - vi. Outdoor leadership \$58-68
- o Those who want to participate but can't afford
 - i. GST rebate is one for options
 - ii. Healthy hunger or the school will pay for field trips that families cannot afford
- Career Learning Practice Guide
 - a. Put out by RVS, how do we introduce careers, explore ideas and then by high school narrow into career of choice
 - b. Younger grades likes and dislikes are discussed, in curriculum teachers will bring in guest speakers
 - c. Career Professionals brought in to speak to grades 7 &8
 - o Esthetics, Athletes, Pilots, Agriculture, Law Enforcement
 - d. Opportunity with Bow Valley College has been offered
 - Our grade 8s will go after spring break and will do immersive experiences at the college
 - Moving forward, we will continue and hopefully bring in more experience options, not just speakers, grade 6s may be included
- Spirit days (April 14-18) - Dress up events
 - a. Mismatch, Tourist, Western, Throw back
- Incident report tracker
 - a. 2.4 incident a day and vast majority were classroom managed
 - Classroom managed these incidents are when teachers would also reach out to parents
 - Grade 1-4 level for majority of those; which is expected
 - i. Lots of teaching happens in these scenarios
 - ii. Intramurals in grade 4s have been introduced
