## **Google Search Quick Tips**

Looking for a specific phrase? Enter it as a quote (in Quotation marks "x").

To **exclude a word** from your search, simply add the word to your search with a **minus sign** in front of it.

To search within a specific website, enter your search term followed by: site:(website).

To locate specific words within a webpage, enter: allintext: (your search terms).

To locate specific words within a title, enter: allintitle: (your search terms).

To locate specific words within a domain name or URL, enter: allinurl: (your search terms).

To find news stories in Google News from a specific location, enter: (your search terms) location:(location).

To search with a wildcard, simply add an asterisk (\*) for a missing word.

There are several symbols that you can use as search operators in Google:

- @ use this when searching for social media tags (@google)
- & use to find strongly connected ideas and phrases like (A&E)
- \$ use to indicate prices, like (sony \$400)
- # use to find content with hashtags (#travel)

To find out the weather at a specific location, enter: weather (city).

Need to do a **quick calculation**? Enter it in the **search window** and your answer will magically appear.

Need to **define a word**? Just type: **define (word)** and Google turns into a dictionary. Need to translate a word? Simple. Just type: translate (word) to (language).
