

NEW: Transportation Fee Information

The RVS Transportation Department would like to remind you of a couple things:

For those transportation families who registered for bus service between June 27 to Aug 15 and selected the 50/50 fee payment option the second/final automatic payment should have been processed on October 1st. For those who registered for bus service after Aug 16th and selected the 50/50 fee payment option, the second/final automatic payment will be processed November 1st.

Should families wish to cancel service, please complete and submit a Transportation Cancellation 2022/23 form by October 31st to obtain a full refund.

[NEW: Assessment Updates from Rocky View School \(Literacy & Numeracy\)](#)

As part of Rocky View Schools' (RVS) plan to ensure that all of our students can read, write, and do math at appropriate levels, we have been engaging in a new assessment cycle alongside all all schools in RVS. Depending on your child's grade, they will be taking part in brief standardized assessments that give the teacher important information about the child's basic skills that can be used to guide instruction or to inform additional supports if needed. There is no preparation needed of your child for these assessments.

Your child's teachers can inform you at student-led conferences about their progress and how we can work together to support their skill development and growth. This information will not be shared as part of Real-Time Reporting in PowerSchool nor is it used to determine their performance level in their respective grade. The purpose is to see where they are at in their basic skills and guide us on a path of improvement.

If you have specific questions about your child's assessments or learning in general, please reach out to your child's teacher.



REMINDER: 22/23 Athletics Schedule, Coaches Needed

Throughout the year, Grade 6, 7 & 8 students have many opportunities to participate in extracurricular sports. We love seeing the enthusiasm, energy, and dedication the kids put into their athletic endeavors. We're also extraordinarily grateful for parents and other members of our community who support these activities with their time as coaches. We would love to have some parent/community coaches lend their time and expertise in developing our young athletes. All sports will have a teacher sponsor or co-coach, so a full commitment to all practices and events may not be necessary.

Our athletic schedule is below, along with the time commitments involved with the sport. To express your interest in coaching a sport, please contact Athletic Director Melanie Hamilton mhamilton@rockyview.ab.ca.

Practices generally run right after school from 2:30-4.

September/October: Junior A Volleyball (10 weeks, 2 practices/week, 3 Friday evening tournaments, one full school day divisional tournament)

October/November: Grade 6 Volleyball (3-4 weeks, 2 practices/week, 1 Friday tournament)

November: Junior B Volleyball (4-5 weeks, 2 practices/week, 3 Friday tournaments)

December/January/February: Junior A Basketball (10 weeks, 2 practices/week, 3 Friday evening tournaments, one full school day divisional tournament)

February/March: Junior B Basketball (4-5 weeks, 2 practices/week, 3 Friday tournaments)

March: Grade 6 Basketball (3-4 weeks, 2 practices a week, 1 Friday tournament)

March/April: Grade 7 and 8 Badminton (5-6 weeks, 2 practices/week, 1 daytime tournament)

April/May: Grade 7 and 8 Track and Field (lunchtime and after school practices for 3-4 weeks)

May/June: Grade 6 Soccer (3 weeks, 2 practices/ week, 1 tournament)

REMINDER: Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests

In May and June of the 2022-23 school year, Fireside School's grade 6 students will write Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) in their core courses. PATs are written by students in grade 6 and grade 9, and they are used to determine if students are learning and understanding course content and achieving course outcomes.

[The Grade 6 Parent Guide, 2022-23](#) is put out by Alberta Education to help parents and families prepare for and understand Provincial Achievement Tests, including how they are used for assessment purposes by the province; schools also look at those results to improve learning. Throughout the year, students will be looking at strategies and skills for doing their best when demonstrating their learning and understanding on assessments, including the PATs, which are one part of the evaluation picture for each student. Please note that, this year, the PATs will make up 5% of each grader 6 student's final grade.

Reminder: School Fees

In order to enhance student safety and school efficiencies, Rocky View Schools have become cashless. All student fees will be posted to *SchoolCash Online* and parents/guardians will receive an email when a new fee is available for payment.

Fee Waiver Applications

Please be aware that there are two separate Fee Waiver Application forms, both requiring proof of GST Rebate:

1. AF5105-A: Optional Course Fee Waiver Form (for Gr 7/8 OCFs) is available from the school office. Once completed, the form is submitted to the school Principal for approval.
2. AF5105-F: Transportation Fee Waiver Form is available through School Engage. This form is routed to the RVS Transportation Department.

REMINDER: Allergy Awareness, including for Events

Some students and staff at Fireside School have nut or fragrance allergies. Therefore, Fireside is a nut-aware and scent-aware school. Please do not send items with nuts to school with students during the school day or to school events, such as tournaments. We also ask that students **not** wear perfume, cologne, essential oils, or other strongly scented products or sprays to school, including to school events such as tournaments, concerts, dances, et cetera. This request includes essential oils with strong scents. Additionally, students should **not** bring perfume, cologne, or body spray products (e.g. Axe, Coconut, Orange) to school with them, including essential oils (e.g. coconut, orange, patchouli, etc.). We ask the same for parents, families, volunteers, or visitors who are entering the school at any time, whether it be to drop something off or to attend meetings, conferences, presentations, or tournaments, please.
