
Greetings Fireside Families & Friends!

On Tuesday, students and staff came together in our Reading Chain to celebrate the finale of our Read-a-Thon: over 800 students and staff read together at the same time on Tuesday morning (pm Kinders read in the afternoon with older students). Our Reading Chain reached from end-to-end of the building on both floors, everyone reading together simultaneously! Excitement was high and book love was definitely on display; it truly symbolised how we are a Community of Readers who loves to read at Fireside School.

At our School Council meeting on Wednesday, we reviewed our school's progress in key areas highlighted in the school's Workbook (formerly known as the School Education Plan). Information was shared about Literacy, School Culture, our Positive Behaviour Strategies and Intervention commitments. Fiona Gilbert (School Trustee for Cochrane) shared updates on the provincial budget announcements and information on the Powell Street School (see below). Parents who were present also provided feedback on what is going well at Fireside School this year, as well as areas for growth. We are grateful for that feedback and information: thank you. #### NEW: Read-a-Thon 2023 ~ Week #4 + Updates + Celebrations

Today was the due date for Master Tracker Log and Pledge Forms: it was a flurry of reading accomplishments and goals met. Week #4 saw students and staff add over 250,000 minutes toward our Read-a-Thon goal: awesome! Final calculations will be completed early next week, and we will be excited to share with you our final achievement of minutes read during Read-a-Thon next week.

Week #4 Draw Prizes will be drawn Monday morning. Then, Super Draw Prizes will be put out! Students can receive ballots for having exceeded reading goals during Read-a-Thon, being the top reader in their classes, sharing their favourite title on their book list with a staff member, and reading every day of Read-a-Thon (as shown on their Master Tracker). Donations for our Super Draws have been kindly provided by community partners such as Holliday Collective, Shredz Shop, Rebel Comics, Found Books & Shops, River Heights Domino's, River Heights Subway, local author J. Neven-Pugh, the Military Museums (Calgary), and others. We are grateful for their donations to our Read-a-Thon.

For your knowledge, we also added a new community sponsor this week: Tim Hortons (Cochrane). We would like to thank them and all our sponsors and community partners for their support of our students and programs.

Now that Read-a-Thon has successfully concluded, we look forward to our Read-a-Thon Celebration Assemblies, which are set to occur on March 22 (times to be announced). At these assemblies, the top reader in each grade will be recognized (\$40 Indigo Gift Card, sponsored by Friends of Fireside). There will be trophies presented to the classes with the most minutes read (one in each K-4 and 5-8) and the most funds raised; these classes will also win a PJ and Movie Party in the gym, with popcorn kindly provided by the Cochrane Movie House. Student Readers also have the opportunity to win draw prizes provided by our community sponsors, including passes for the Cochrane Movie House; and a variety of different gift cards from MacKay's Ice Cream, Tim Hortons, or Found Books & Shop if they reached various benchmarks of minutes by the end of Read-a-Thon (over 500 minutes through over 5000 minutes). Also, students who read every day of Read-a-Thon will be entered into a draw for one of four day passes for Calaway Park or one of four family passes to Spray Lake Sawmills Family Recreation Centre. And staff will have their own draw prizes this year as well, kindly sponsored by Found Books & Shops. Additionally, the Top 3 Readers in K-4 and 5-8, as well as the top 3 Staff Readers will receive prizes, kindly sponsored by Found Books & Shop. We're asking all students and staff to take and bring in a picture that represents their reading experience over Read-a-Thon. ## UPDATED AND REVISED: CONNECT Parenting Virtual Program Opportunity

The dates for the CONNECT Parenting Virtual Program hosted by RVS Family School Liaisons (FSL)have changed to Thursday evenings from March 16th-May 25th (no class on April 13), for 1.5 hours each week in Zoom. This program is a FREE 9-Week program to support parents of pre-teens and teens. Some of the key questions it explores include: Do you ever feel that your teen doesn't listen to you? Do you sometimes even feel pushed away? Do parents matter?

Co-developed over the last 10 years by the Maples Adolescent Treatment Centre and Simon Fraser University, the program focuses on core components of secure attachment to promote children's social, emotional, and behavioural adjustment. Connect helps caregivers understand basic attachment concepts that can be applied across a broad range of situations and relational concepts. Each session provides parents with an attachment perspective on parent-child relationships and adolescent development. How to access family supports and additional resources will also be a focus within the sessions.

#### **UPDATED: Assurance Survey**

The Alberta Education Assurance survey should be arriving in family's mailboxes who have students in grades 4, 7, and 10. The deadline for completing the survey is March 17th. Grade 4 and 7 students and staff will be surveyed in school. Thank you for providing important data to help shape our school planning and decision making.

#### UPDATED: Powell Street School Utilization – Changes to Fireside Proposed

On Thursday, March 2, RVS held its second public consultation on the utilization of the Powell Street School. RVS reviewed five potential scenarios, up from 3 scenarios presented at the public consultation held in January. The proposals put forward are as follows:

- A) Move K-4 students in the neighborhoods east of highway 22 and south of the Bow River to the Powell Street School. Those students would return to Fireside for grades 5 to 8.
- B) Move all K-4 French Immersion students to the Powell Street School. Elizabeth Barrett and Glenbow School would then also house grade 5 students. Mitford and Manachaban would become mostly Grade 6 to 8 schools (Manachaban would retain Grade 5 FI).
- C) Move K-4 students from the communities of Heartland (currently attending Glenbow) and East Cochrane (currently attending Elizabeth Barrett) to the Powell Street School.
- D) Move K-5 students attending Cochrane Christian Academy (CCA), currently housed in Mitford School, to the Powell Street School. 6-8 students at CCA would remain at Mitford.
- E) Move all students attending CCA (K-8) to the Powell Street School

A number of these scenarios further impact other schools as space is created in those vacated. Details can be found at <u>www.rvsengage.com</u>. Feedback on these proposals can also be provided on this site. We encourage Fireside families with an interest in the outcome of this decision to share your views with the board.

# **REMINDER: Immunization for Kindergarten Students**

As you plan for your child attending kindergarten, it is an ideal time to review your child's immunization history. It is important to keep your child's immunizations up to date to prevent disease and to help keep your child healthy.

Children are due for these routine vaccines at 4 years of age:

- Diphtheria/ Pertussis/ Tetanus/ Polio
- Measles / Mumps / Rubella / Chickenpox

#### **REMINDER: Reading Comments in PowerSchool**

Please look in PowerSchool for the January 31 Reading Comment. This comment is an update on your child's reading level for instructional reading and comprehension. It also includes information on your child's reading behaviours and areas of strength when reading, as well as next steps for continued growth. As always, if there are any questions, please reach out to your child's Homeroom Teacher.

# **REMINDER: Allergy Awareness and Reminders**

- Citrus (e.g. orange, lemon, lime, citrus scented sanitizer, etc.)
- Vanilla (e.g. body lotion, cream, perfume, sprays, sanitizer, etc.)
- Coconut (e.g. body lotion, cream, perfume, sanitizer, etc.)
- Floral Scents (e.g. body lotion, cream, perfume, sanitizer, etc.)
- Nuts (please note that we are a nut-aware school)

An Attachment-Based Program to Support Parents & Caregivers

# Do you ever feel that your teen doesn't listen to you? Do you sometimes even feel pushed away? Do parents matter?

Actually, there is very good evidence that strong relationships with parents protect youth from risk during **adolescence** and help them thrive! We call that **ATTACHMENT!!** 

Connect is a **FREE** 9 -week program to support parents of pre-teens and teens. Parents meet in groups of 10-16 with two trained group leaders for 1.5 hours per week.

Co-developed over the last 10 years by the Maples Adolescent Treatment Centre and Simon Fraser University, the program focuses on core components of secure attachment to promote children's social, emotional, and behavioural adjustment. Connect helps caregivers understand basic attachment concepts that can be applied across a broad range of situations and relational concepts.

Each session provides parents with an attachment perspective on parent-child relationships and adolescent development. Parents watch role-plays, do exercises and discuss ways of responding to challenging behaviour and problems. After each session, parents receive handouts with key points to remember when applying the principles to their own parentchild relationship.
