



Greetings Families and Friends of Fireside,

We heard your feedback and are happy to deliver the first edition of Fireside Focus on the web. With RVS's moving our school-wide messages from email to the School Messenger software, we recognized that our pdf version was difficult to read, particularly on mobile devices. Our hope is that this will alleviate some of those issues.

We also want to mention that PowerSchool's user interface on the app is far less functional than on the website⁴'s desktop interface. Many functions and pieces of information that teachers are putting into their grade books is not accessible through the mobile app. We'd like to encourage parents to look through PowerSchool on your desktop computers to get a more detailed view of your student's progress, particularly with three-way conferences right around the corner. Conference Manager will close for bookings on Monday at noon.

Last week brought some lovely weather back to recess, as well as the opportunity for students to mingle across the grades for the first time since before Covid restrictions were implemented. The new recess format excited many of our students who had the chance to play in areas (such as the hill along the fence) that have been off-limits until now.

Reminder: CONNECT Parenting Virtual Program Opportunity

The dates for the CONNECT Parenting Virtual Program hosted by RVS Family School Liaisons (FSL)have changed to Thursday evenings from March 16th-May 25th (no class on April 13), for 1.5 hours each week in Zoom. This program is a FREE 9-Week program to support parents of pre-teens and teens. Some of the key questions it explores include: Do you ever feel that your teen doesn't listen to you? Do you sometimes even feel pushed away? Do parents matter?

Co-developed over the last 10 years by the Maples Adolescent Treatment Centre and Simon Fraser University, the program focuses on core components of secure attachment to promote children's social, emotional, and behavioural adjustment. Connect helps caregivers understand basic attachment concepts that can be applied across a broad range of situations and relational concepts. Each session provides parents with an attachment perspective on parent-child relationships and adolescent development. How to access family supports and additional resources will also be a focus within the sessions.
