Cell Phones in School

We'd like to remind families of the school's cell phone use policies for students: Students are not allowed to access their cell phones during instructional hours. While the expectation is that students keep cell phones in their lockers, as long as they are not accessing them in class, this is not something that is strictly enforced. However, when a staff member finds a student using their phones (whether inside the classroom or not), the student is given a warning reminder and sent to their lockers to secure their phones. Further instances of accessing phones will result in the phones being brought to the office where they will be returned directly their owners (typically parents who own the cellular contracts on the phones). Students may use their phones during unstructured times (recesses, lunch).
