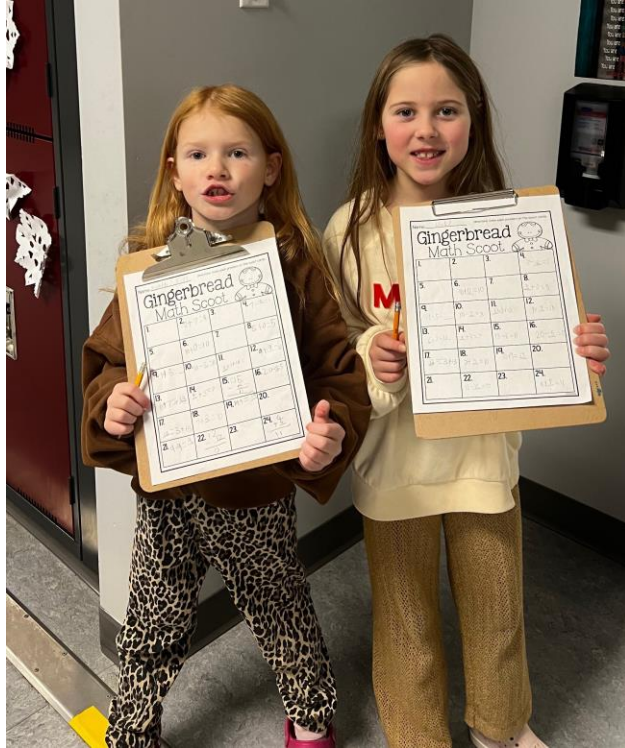


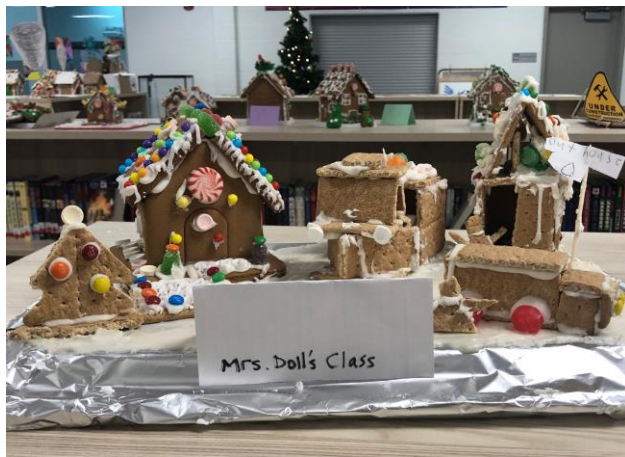

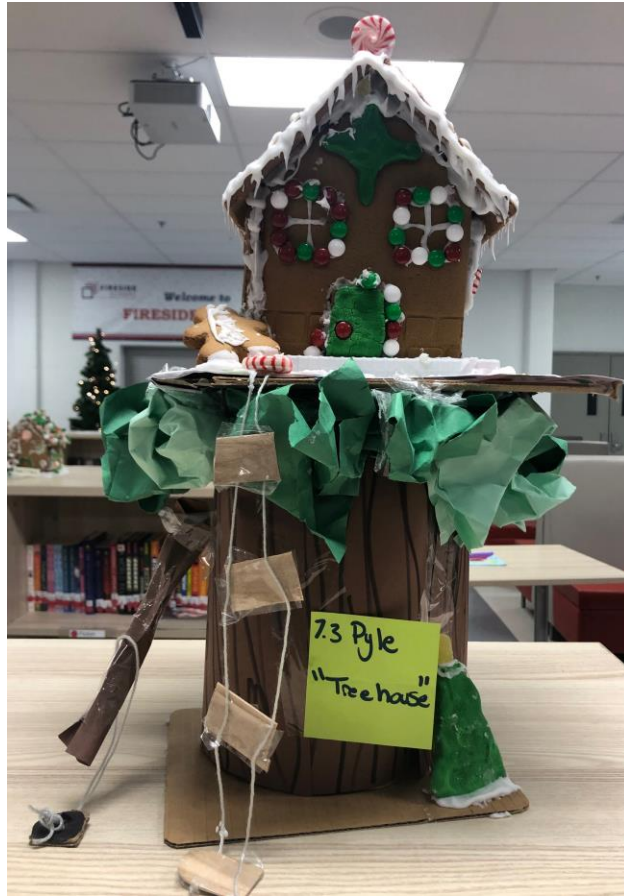

Reading Over the Winter Break

Many students signed out books from the Fireside Library to bring home to read over the break. There were many excited conversations with Mr. Lofthouse about what book might be best.

Ways to help your child keep reading and discussing what they're reading over the break include:

- writing and reading seasonal cards to family and friends;
- reading books about all of the holidays being celebrated this winter;
- setting aside some family reading time each day, whether it's reading own books or reading together;
- trying a reading challenge, where your child sets a reading goal for each day (this is also good practice to be ready for Read-a-Thon at the end of January);
- helping your child select a new book series to read and read it together;
- taking reading on the road with an audiobook if you're traveling during the break;
- asking your child questions such as
 - Why did you pick this book?

- Based on the cover, what do you think the book will be about?
- Will you catch me up on the book? What's happened so far?
- If you were a character, what would you have done differently and why?
- What does the place/setting or character look like in your head while you're reading? Describe it to me.
- Did you learn any new words or facts?
- What was your favourite part of the book and why?
- How was the problem in the book solved? Would you have changed the ending and why?
- What was the most important lesson or fact you learned from reading the book?
- going through the picture book only looking at the pictures and having your child make up their own story;
- or talking to your child about what they're reading by having them tell you about the story or book, having them put the events in order.

School Bus Reminders for the New Year

If your child rides a school bus, please take a few moments to review the bus rules with them before January 8.

Safety while riding the school bus includes helping riders to remember to:

- always listen to the bus driver and instructions they are giving at any time.
- use handrails getting on and off the bus and secure items such as backpacks.
- sit down in the assigned seat as quickly as possible (riders must follow the seating plan).
- stay seated (e.g. back to the back of the seat) and face forward.
- not walk around or switch seats inside the bus while it's moving.
- keep the aisles clear.
- keep their head, hands, and arms inside the bus (not out the windows).
- wait until the bus comes to a full stop **before** they stand up to exit.
- talk quietly; do not shout or scream on the bus so the driver can concentrate.

- be courteous and kind to other people riding the bus.
- use appropriate language at all times.
- report any incidents or concerns to the driver.
