

From the Admin Desk

Hello Fireside Families & Friends,

This week was as varied as the weather here at Fireside! Grade 2s focused into their learning using a reindeer theme, including "reindeer games" in Language Arts and Math. Grade 8 students used a variety of creative materials to demonstrate their understandings of cells, building them and showcasing them in class. And Grade 7 and 8 students started their Term 2 options, including Drama, French, and Outdoor Leadership. Band students had the opportunity to learn from a specialist clinician during their option class.







On Wednesday, we welcomed parents into the building for School Council and the Friends of Fireside meetings. At School Council, RVS Board Chair Fiona Gilbert shared highlights from November 30's Board Meeting, which included talking about the enrolment growth funding coming to school boards from Alberta Education that was announced on November 28. School Council Chair Krystle Anderson shared highlights about Fireside School's first Games Night a few weeks ago, and there were discussions about other events that families might enjoy in 2024. Since Purdy's Chocolates orders were delivered earlier in the day, there were also sweet things to talk about at the Friends of Fireside meeting, including the success of fundraising already this year.

Kindergarten students worked on ornaments too, also exploring story stations involving creativity, literacy, and numeracy. Grade 1s began practising hockey skills and games in PE, while Grade 7s and 8s

focused on basketball as that season officially begins for Junior A Basketball Teams next week (see above for tournament dates).





Singing was heard in classrooms and the music rooms throughout the day, as our Kindergarten, Grade 1, and Grade 2 students practice for their upcoming Winter Concert on Tuesday, December 19 (see below). And on Thursday, the start of Chanukah, Grade 1s viewed a video kindly made by teacher Allyson Billings to help them learn about Chanukah's traditions, including lighting the Menorah and playing Dreidel. Grade 1s then designed their own Dreidel to play the game.



Earlier today, Grade 4 hosted their Market, furthering their learning about product development, running a business, and class economies. Other classes and staff toured through the market to see what fun, unique items were available. See below to view a few of the businesses students created!

We hope everyone has a wonderful and cozy weekend.



We would like to ask families to respect the following courtesies when using the Kiss-and-Go:

- Please do not use lane to park at any time during the day, even if you are remaining in or near your vehicle.
- Please ensure the lane remains accessible at all times during the day. Stopping in the entry curve prevents vehicles from entering the lane.
- Please avoid using the accessible (first) stopping point if you do not have an accessibility card.

To watch a child, grieve and not know what to do is a profoundly difficult experience for parents, teachers, and caregivers. There are many life experiences that can produce feelings of grief in a child, from the death of a relative or a divorce in the family to more everyday experiences such as moving to a new neighbourhood or losing a prized possession. The pandemic has added even more reasons, with children grieving the loss of normalcy and a sense of safety. This session is to help adults counter the false idea of "not feeling bad" and to empower children with positive, effective methods of dealing with loss. We will look at guidelines for helping children develop a lifelong, healthy response to loss and how you can support them through these tough times.
