## Read-a-Thon Wrap Up

Read-a-Thon finished on Monday with a whole-school Reading Chain. For this finale event, everyone in the school came together to read for 20 minutes. It was quite a sight to see; please ask your children about it.

Right now, our Master Tracker is showing that we've read over 550,000 minutes! Although there are still some calculations to be done, we feel confident in declaring that we met and exceeded our reading goal this year: amazing job!!!

Many students brought in their Master Minutes Trackers and Pledge Forms to Homeroom Teachers this week: thank you. As noted in emails and previous issues of Focus, the information on these forms will be used to confirm students' submitted minutes and totals. This information will also be used to help us know the top reader in each grade, the top fundraiser, and those who will be entered into draw prizes provided by our Community Sponsors (see below), including draws for 1 of 4 Calaway Park passes or a 3month Family Pass for SLC. These prizes and awards will be presented at our Celebration Assemblies.

Celebration Assemblies will be held on Thursday, March 7. When we return from February Break, notifications will be sent home for recipients in advance of this event. The last week of February, our Read-a-Thon Super Draws will also take place where students whose Master Trackers show they've read every day will also receive Super Draw ballots. ## Submitting Read-a-Thon Pledges

Thank you to everyone who submitted Pledge Forms for Read-a-Thon. The funds raised during this event will go toward new literacy and reading resources for Fireside School students.

There are two ways for Pledges to be honoured:
1.Pay for the Pledge once charged to a student's account: Once the Pledge Form has been turned in and has been processed through the office, the total pledged amount will be charged to the student's School Cash Online account. Please note that funds that have already been received by the school via donation (see below) will be deducted from the amount owed prior to the amount being posted. These amounts will be posted the last week of February for payment.

2. Make a Donation: Log in to your School Cash Online account. From the Items tab, choose the "Make A Donation" bar. Enter the donation amount and choose Fireside School from the Fund Destination dropdown. In the message box, enter 'Read-a-Thon: [Student's Name]' (e.g. "Read-a-Thon: Jill Smith) - it is very important to specify the student's name(s) so that he/she/they get the credit for the donation. Donations can be paid with the donor's credit card. A donation receipt will be emailed upon completion of the cart checkout.
