

Hello Fireside Families & Friends,

We had a wonderful wintery week at Fireside. Some weekend snow and mild temperatures made for great conditions for recesses, Iqaluit Day (see below for pictures), an Outdoor Education field trip, Winter Walk Day on Wednesday, and plenty of trips down the frozen slopes below the playground. We also had some fun things going on in the school, including classes starting soccer skills in gym, Guest Reader Sharon Cronin (RVS, Director of Instructional Leadership & Learning) visiting several of our classes, and Mr. Petterson's Shop class racing the cars they'd made while Grade 1 classes looked on and judged.

We also had many parent volunteers in the school this week, helping with Fun Lunch and Grade 2 Iqaluit Day. Our Grade 2 students experienced many aspects of Inuit culture throughout the day, including building Inukshuks out of ice, which you can see displayed in the spaces beside the bus lane.







On Wednesday, we had familiar faces and several new ones at our School Council and Friends of Fireside meetings. RVS Board Chair Fiona Gilbert (Trustee Ward 6 - Cochrane) brought the Board Update, including information on protocols for inclement weather, transportation changes coming in 2025, and continuing challenges in securing enough bus drivers and buses for many routes in RVS. She also highlighted the new bus app that is currently being tested and will be rolled out to families soon. Our School Council Chair Krystle Anderson led discussions about Fun Lunches and upcoming events. Friends of Fireside kindly awarded funding to support to our Read-a-Thon for final awards and prizes and also provided updates on the upcoming Babysitter and Home Alone opportunities (see below), as well as March Madness (see below). Their next meetings will be held at Fireside School on Wednesday, March 6; please know that new members are always welcome.

Read-a-Thon is ON! -- Week #2





As of Monday, 215,000 minutes have already been recorded so far for this year's Read-a-Thon: amazing! As the week has progressed, classroom trackers are blooming with each day's minutes, and we can't wait to add to our Master Tracker in the Learning Commons new minutes that come in from Week #2 (to be submitted by Monday, please – see below).

We are just finishing up Week #2 of Read-a-Thon today! Awesome reading, sharing of books and book love, and friendly reading competitions have been going on throughout the week. It is so exciting to hear about all the reading that's also happening at home! Many students also took a moment to measure themselves on the height post Mrs. Cheverie created near the Grade 1 hallway, so they could see which fictional character is closest to them in size.

Your child's Homeroom Teacher will be communicating At-School Minutes to you today. **If your student was absent on any day, please simply put an "A" in that space on their Master Minutes Tracker page.** Please calculate the total At School Minutes and At Home/On Own Minutes for your child, and record it on their Master Tracker in the appropriate spaces for Week #2. These totals are what to enter in the Read-a-Thon Minutes Google Form.

As of today, you can use the <u>Read-a-Thon Minutes Google Form</u> to enter your child's At School and At Home On Own Minutes information for Week #2 (Week 2 includes: Saturday, Feb. 3 to Friday, Feb. 9). The Week #2 <u>Read-a-Thon Minutes Google Form</u> will be open from Friday, Feb. 9 until Sunday, Feb. 11.

Our first set of draw prizes were given out Tuesday; the names of the 18 winners were announced on Wednesday after all prizes had been given out by our Super Reader Leaders Laura Wright and Liam Blackwell. Entries for Week #2 Draw Prizes can still be put in prize boxes on Monday, Feb. 12; these draws will include the last three days of Read-a-Thon as well and will be made Tuesday morning. Based on what's been submitted through the Read-a-Thon Minutes Google Form and the returned Master Minutes Trackers, some students may receive additional ballots for Super Draws, including things such as being one of the top five readers in Week #1 and/or Week #2, being one of the school's top readers or the top readers in their classes, among other things.

Monday, February 12 is our last day of Read-a-Thon. At School and At Home/On Own Minutes totals for this weekend (Saturday, Feb. 10 and Sunday, Feb. 11) and Monday, Feb. 12 can be entered in the Read-

<u>a-Thon Minutes Google Form</u> starting Monday, February 12; it will be open through Wednesday, February 14.

Please send your child's Master Minutes Tracker and Pledge Form pages back to your child's Homeroom Teacher next Tuesday, February 13. These forms will be used to help confirm minutes submitted, as well as look at who the top reader in each grade is, as well as the top fundraiser.

Information from Master Minutes Trackers will be used to confirm reading minutes and will help us know which students are eligible to be entered into the draws for reaching specific minutes benchmarks during Read-a-Thon; these draws will be presented at our Celebration Assembly. It will also help us to know the top reader in each grade (receives a \$40 Indigo Gift Card, kindly sponsored by Friends of Fireside), and those students who read every day of Read-a-Thon (who will then be entered in a draw for 1 of 4 Calaway Park passes or 1 3-month Family Pass for SLC). The Celebration Assembly will occur on Thursday, March 7; letters will be sent to parents of recipients.

- Eye health





Earlier in the fall, all Kindergarten parents received a parent package from Eye See...Eye Learn™. Alberta Health Services provides coverage towards the eye exams for all Kindergarten students in Alberta. The program also provides free eyeglasses to those Kindergarten students who are found to need eyeglasses.

The Alberta Association of Optometrists has requested we send the information out one more time, digitally, as a reminder to our Kindergarten parents so they are aware of this opportunity. Here is it!

Has your child had their annual eye exam? It's important to do before they start school!

Eye See...Eye Learn™ is a program that provides kindergarten-aged students with a

comprehensive eye exam from an optometrist. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. If required, kindergarten-aged students also receive a free pair of eyeglasses.

How kindergarten-aged students participate

Step 1 Parents can find a participating optometrist at optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and **Eye See...Eye Learn™**, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. Call and book an appointment.

Step 2 See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready. There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19.

Step 3 If required, kindergarten-aged students will receive a free pair of eyeglasses. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

*Free glasses are covered by a one year manufacturer's warranty.

Who can participate?

Eye See...Eye Learn™ is available to all kindergarten-aged students in Alberta. It's important to address eye health and vision problems before children begin school.

Children are eligible from August until they begin grade one.

Eye exam coverage

There is Alberta Health coverage towards your child's eye exams up to age 19. It's a painless, non-invasive process that could change their lives!

Did you know?

- 80% of learning is visual.
- 1 in 4 school-aged children has a vision problem.

- An eye exam detects health problems such as crossed eyes or lazy eye.
- Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural disabilities.
- The earlier an eye health or visual problem is identified, the more likely it can be corrected.
- Children often don't know they have a vision problem, as they believe what they are seeing is normal.
- It is not uncommon for parents to believe they would know if their child has a vision problem, because these issues can be hard to spot particularly if there is a problem in only one of the eyes.



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


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
