



2024 Read-a-Thon Begins Next Friday!

Read-a-Thon 2024 begins NEXT FRIDAY! We are very excited to start our event this year, and we'll be sure to share updates and information with you all in *Focus* each week.

This year, Read-a-Thon will run for 17 days, ending on Monday, February 12. A package of information will come home with your children next Thursday so that you have everything you need to support them as we "Read ON for Read-a-Thon" in 2024.

Our theme is *Book Love: Growing Readers*. It speaks to the seed of love of books and reading we plant and grow each year, how we are growing together as we share our love of books with others, and how our readers are growing as they engage with reading. Given that we are a school and a place of learning, "growing" readers is part of the deal, so to speak. Thus, this year, classroom trackers will be gardens or flowers, as learning in and about outdoor spaces is also a key aspects at Fireside School.

Students will receive Pledge Forms in the information package. Our FUNdraising this year will go toward adding new Literacy Kits and Book Sets to our school's literacy resources. This, too, will help us continue the Book Love!

Engagement is always high level for Read-a-Thon, and our students and staff have made it amazing in different ways each year so far. Thus, we are very excited to see where this year's Read-a-Thon event takes us as they make it come alive in our school. Although it is a shorter time frame this year, it will definitely be a fun time, no doubt.

One new aspect this year is that each reader (with help from parents and caregivers) will submit each "week's" minutes using an online GoogleForm. That link will be sent out to families and will also be in *Focus* starting February 2.

Here are the time-frames for each week of Read-a-Thon:

- Week 1: Jan 26 to Feb 2 (submit minutes for these dates between Friday, Feb. 2 and Sunday, Feb 4)
- Week 2: Feb 3 to Feb 9 (submit minutes for these dates between Friday, Feb. 9 and Sunday, Feb 11)
- Week 3: Feb 10 to Feb 12 (submit minutes for these dates between Monday, Feb. 12 and Wednesday Feb. 14)

The reading information to be submitted for each time frame will be clearly marked on the Master Tracker Form, and instructions will be included on the top of the GoogleForm to help you know what to do. Students can receive further ballots to enter for each week's draw prizes based on the information submitted.

Master Tracker Forms and Pledge Forms are due back to Homeroom Teachers on Tuesday, February 13. This information will be used to confirm reading minutes and to see which students are eligible to enter the draws for the Read-a-Thon Celebration Assembly. The Celebration Assembly will occur the last week in February or first week in March; please stay tuned for updates.

We are very excited for Read-a-Thon 2024: get ready to read read!



Next Monday, January 22, online registration for Kindergarten 2024-25 school year will open on the Rocky View Schools website.

Kindergarten registration for the 2024/25 school year will open in SchoolEngage next week on Jan. 22. This is an exciting milestone for both learners and their families, as it marks the starting point of an educational journey for many children that will see them through to their teenage years and set them up for success throughout their lives.
