Hello Fireside Families & Friends,

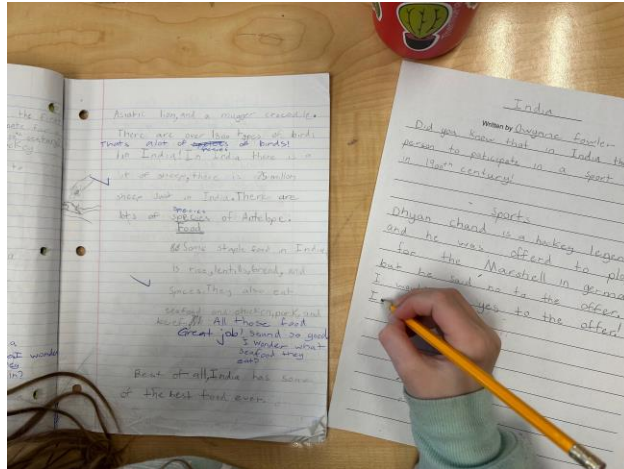
Students were very excited to go back outside for recesses this week. Many were making snow slides or snowpeople or snowforts to play in during their outdoor time. In PE this week, students were focusing on a variety of basketball skills, including accuracy, team work, and persevering even when you do not make the first shot perfectly.



Grade 3 students in Mrs. Billings's class researched facts about India (including its culture and geography) this week, exploring elements of the country's culture, food, celebrations, geography, and wildlife. Once they completed their research, they practiced full sentence and paragraph writing, adding "hooks" to grab attention, along with their personal reactions to what they'd learned.

On Friday, the whole school participated in a Reading Chain to kick off Read-a-Thon. Every student and staff member (over 900 people) all read together for 20 minutes. That's over 18,000 minutes of reading to start us off on this year's Read-a-Thon! Read ON for 2024 Read-a-Thon!

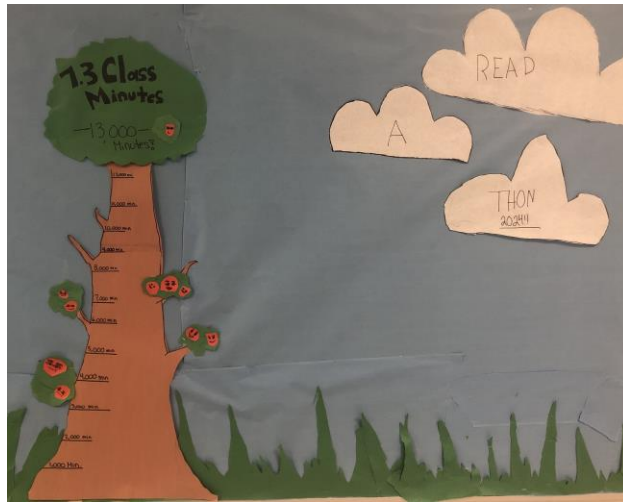
Read-a-Thon 2024 started FRIDAY with a whole-school Reading Chain. Each Homeroom Class was buddied with another class to read together. Students and staff formed a "chain" of readers on both floors of the school to kick-off our event for this year. And it's going to be another amazing Read-a-Thon at Fireside School, we have no doubts!

This year, Read-a-Thon will run from Friday, January 26 through Monday, February 12. Yesterday (Thursday), a package of information should've come home with your children so that you have everything you need to support them as we "Read ON for Read-a-Thon" in 2024.

Each student set an individual learning goal on the top of the Pledge Form, and tomorrow they can start tracking their At Home/On Own Minutes. At School Minutes for Week #1 will be communicated home next Friday so Week 1 Minutes can be submitted in the new [Google Form](#) (see below for more information).

To participate in the FUNdraiser, Readers can sign up family, friends, neighbours, and others to support them in their reading for Read-a-Thon. Our FUNdraising this year will go toward adding new Literacy Kits and Book Sets to our school's literacy resources so we can continue the Book Love here at Fireside!

Many classes were already getting their Classroom Trackers ready on Thursday so they're ready to roll. Also, Mrs. Clancy has designed the Master School Tracker in the Learning Commons so we can celebrate each step we take toward reaching our goal of reading at least 500,000 minutes. We look forward to sharing each week's level with you in the coming weeks.







As they reach reading goals, share their reading with others, and read read read for Week 1 next week, students will have the opportunity to receive draw ballots from staff members; those ballots can be entered in for draw prizes. Entries can be put in Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

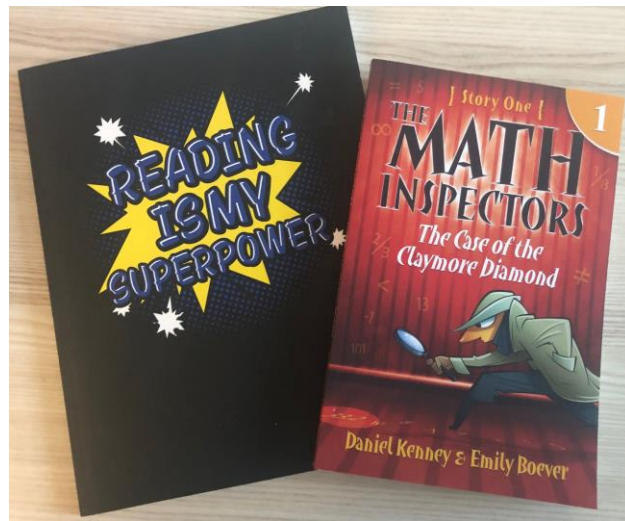
One new aspect this year is that each reader (with help from parents and caregivers) will enter each "week's" minutes into our new [online GoogleForm](#).

Here are the time-frames for each week of Read-a-Thon:

- Week 1: Jan 26 to Feb 2 (submit minutes for these dates between Friday, Feb. 2 and Sunday, Feb 4)
- Week 2: Feb 3 to Feb 9 (submit minutes for these dates between Friday, Feb. 9 and Sunday, Feb 11)
- Week 3: Feb 10 to Feb 12 (submit minutes for these dates between Monday, Feb. 12 and Wednesday Feb. 14)

The reading information to be submitted for each time frame will be clearly marked on the Master Tracker Form, and instructions will be included on the top of the GoogleForm to help you know what to

do. Students can receive further ballots to enter for each week's draw prizes based on the information submitted.

Master Tracker Forms and Pledge Forms are due back to Homeroom Teachers on Tuesday, February 13. This information will be used to confirm reading minutes and will help us know which students are eligible to be entered into the draws for reaching specific minutes benchmarks during Read-a-Thon; these draws will be presented at our Celebration Assembly. These pages will also help us to know who is the top reader in each grade (who will receive a \$40 Indigo Gift Card, kindly sponsored by Friends of Fireside), and those students who read every day of Read-a-Thon (who will then be entered in a draw for 1 of 4 Calaway Park passes or 1 3-month Family Pass for SLC). The Celebration Assembly will occur the last week in February or first week in March; please stay tuned for updates as we get nearer to that time.

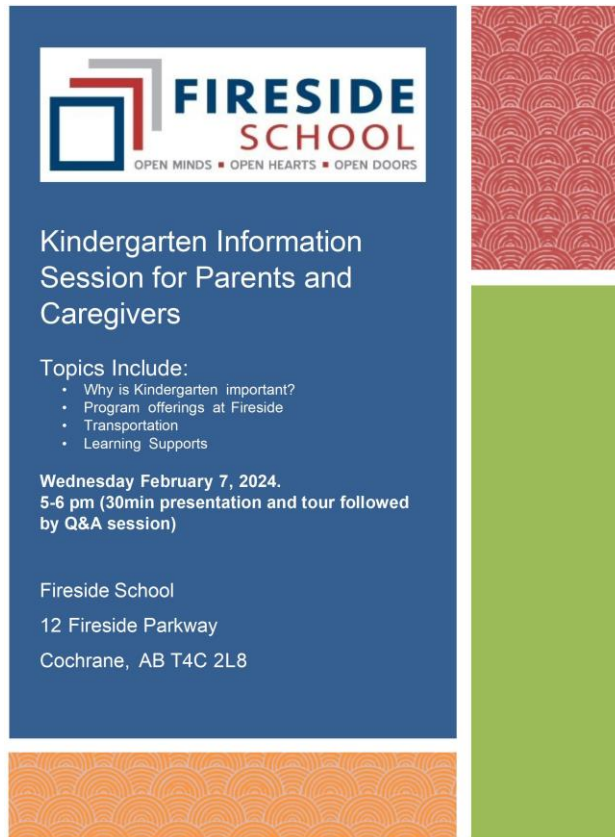
