

On Monday, April 8th (our first day back from Spring Break), from approximately 11:48am to 1:40pm, a partial solar eclipse will be observable in Alberta. During a solar eclipse the shadow of the moon will

pass over Canada. This occurs when the moon passes between the sun and the earth, culminating with the moon fully or partially blocking the sun. A solar eclipse allows us to see the sun's tenuous atmosphere — the corona — glowing around the moon.

While exciting, it is imperative that we prioritize the well-being of our students during this event. Direct solar observation poses a significant risk of eye damage; therefore, it is critical that all students adhere strictly to safety protocols to avoid any potential harm. Teachers will remind students before going outside for lunch recess that they are not look directly into the sun.
