Among other topics, we were pleased to hear from Trustee Fiona Gilbert who reiterated the Provincial Government's approval of construction funding for a K-8 school in Rivercrest. When operational, it will almost certainly come as a welcome relief from student population pressures at Fireside.

Read-a-Thon Assemblies were held on Thursday, celebrating more than 840,000 minutes of reading and over \$14,000 raised by our school to support the purchase of books and literacy resources in our school. Read-a-Thon Celebration Assemblies were a huge success on Thursday, seeing 127+ students receiving prizes and awards. Paired with our SOAR Assemblies, students in K-8 attended to see who had won the sponsored draw prizes for reaching reading benchmarks and who were the top readers and fundraisers this year.

All together, Fireside School read 840,047 minutes: AMAZING! We raised \$14,259, which will go toward purchasing book sets, literacy kits, and other reading resources to continue to build our book love together. The classes that will have bragging rights this year as being the Most Minutes Read as a Class in K-4 and 5-8, as well as the Highest Fundraising were also announced. Mrs. Cooledge's Grade 2 Class won Most Minutes Read in K-4 AND Highest Fundraisers; Mrs. Lawrence's Grade 5 Class won Most Minutes Read in 5-8. 
Reminder: Bow Valley High School Performing Arts Presents Willy Wonka
