National Day for Truth and Reconciliation - Orange Shirt Day Ceremonies





On Thursday, all classes came to the gym grade-by-grade to participate in this year's *Gathering Ceremony* in recognition of Orange Shirt Day. Each class presented its understandings about how to create a safe, caring, welcoming school, unlike the ones where many Indigenous people were taken during the time of residential schools. Each class designed a poster that represented the learning environment they want to create in order to be a place where all students feel safe, cared for, and accepted. Each student individually designed a hawk feather that contained words and images of how they each will help to make everyone in the school feel like they matter; they put their feathers in the Gathering Circle alongside their class's posters. Throughout the day, as the Gathering Circle grew, the respectful way students engaged in learning the importance of feeling happy and safe at school clearly began to emerge.





RVS Indigenous Learning Specialist Jeff Horvath joined each grade's sharing circle to talk about the importance of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation - Orange Shirt Day and why we recognize it as Canadians, as well as the importance of connection and belonging in school. At the closing of each circle, CDA Charlene Abrahams "stitched" together the classroom posters using yarn. In doing this, all posters and feathers became inter-connected to demonstrate Fireside School's commitment to safe, respectful, responsible actions that make everyone feel like they have a safe, happy, caring school experience.
