NEW: Volunteering



NEW: Grade 2 Snowglobes

Grade 2 classes have been discussing worries this week. After brainstorming the worries and fears they had, they talked about how fears and worries are normal, and students noticed that many of their worries were shared by others in the class. Finally, students worked on a snowglobe activity: when a snowglobe is shaken, the snow flies out of control like a blizzard, but it calms in time. Students looked at the "tools they have in their toolboxes" to help calm themselves down when things feel out of control around them. Then, each student completed the snowglobe activity, including what they felt will help them find calm and cope with their worries. The conversations and discussions during this activity were powerful for these students and the staff who work with them each day. These things bring me peace and help me settle my snow globe!

Did you know that Thursday, January 27th is Family Literacy Day? Here are 12 questions you could discuss and explore when reading together:

- 1. Could this story be true? Why or why not?
- 2. Where is the setting of this story?
- 3. Who is this story about? Tell me what you know from the book about him or her or them.
- 4. What words would you use to describe the main character? Why?
- 5. Do you like the main character? Why or why not?
- 6. Does the main character have a problem? What is it?
- 7. How is the problem solved? (What is the solution?)

8. What is the scariest, funniest, saddest, most interesting, or most funny part of the story? Read it aloud.

9. Do you like this story? Why or why not?

10. Do you know any real people who are like the characters in this story? Who are the people and how are they similar or different?

11. Would you like to be a character from the story? Why or why not?

12. Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?

Reminder: Advanced Registration 2022/23

On Monday, January 24th at 8:00 a.m., registration for the 2022/23 school year will begin. This is only for children who will be new to Fireside School next year and not for individuals moving from one grade to the next. Families registering their children in Kindergarten will use this process; it is important to note that morning and afternoon times are not on a first come, first serve basis and will be determined at a later date. A child must be five years of age by December 31 of the year they begin Kindergarten. Please note: students who do not attend Kindergarten in 2021/22 and are six years of age or older on Sept. 1, 2022, must start Grade 1 next fall, as required by Alberta Education.

REMINDER: Daily Health Checklist Usage

The Alberta Government recently updated its <u>Alberta Daily Health Checklist</u> (click on the link to view). Please ensure that students are completing this checklist each day before leaving for school. Parents/Guardians play an essential role, as they support actions in the home (such as keeping children/students home when sick and accessing testing if symptoms develop) that ultimately keep other children, students, and staff safe.
