Hello, families and friends of Fireside!

We've had a lot of excitement this week as we kicked off Fireside School's first Read-a-Thon Event on Thursday, February 27, for Family Literacy Day and "I Love to Read" Month! (Please see below for further details.) Today saw students busily crafting and designing their Class Tracker Minutes Thermometers, while the School-Wide ones for students and staff went up in the library. Talk of books and reading and goals for minutes students wish to read were in the air: Book Love is alive and well at Fireside!





We also saw our Grade 2 class host their Iqaluit Day on Thursday, which included making Inukshuks in the outdoor space alongside the bus lane.

Grade 8 students showed off their candy-designed cell projects and photography students were taking photos around the school, including trying to find in-the-moment features that look like letters.





Students were also working on the goals they set during our school-wide community activity block last week: seeking how they could positively contribute to building a sense of community within our school. From making signs to post with fun, positive messages in Mrs. Doll and Mr. McCormick's classes, to Mrs. Billings's grade 3 class who shared their SWA class goals in their classroom window, inspired by a quote from Maya Angelou "Try to be a rainbow in someone's cloud," there were some very heartwarming moments throughout our days here as we connected with others and worked to build a community where we have Open Hearts.

Thursday, January 27th was the first day of Fireside School's Read-a-thon. Students all received the letter, Pledge Form, and Time Log sheet to bring home with all the information. Excitement and a love of reading has already begun to move through the building!

Here are some of the highlights:

- The Read-a-Thon is a FUNdraiser to build a love of books and reading for students and staff.
- All funds from this FUNdraiser will go toward the Outdoor Learning Space, adding to the funds from the Casino Nights (March 20-21), organized by The Friends of Fireside Society
- There are prizes to be won for a variety of reading minutes and fundraising achievements (please see letter and video for more information), including a gift card for the Scholastic Book Fair in April for the top reader in each grade (kindly sponsored by Friends of Fireside).
- Each class is tracking their minutes on a Thermometer Minutes Tracker, which they created in class today (some classes have already updated their minutes for yesterday and today).
- Families can help to ensure students are keeping track of their "Read with Me" or At-Home Reading Minutes; they can also help by being sure to calculate School + Home Minutes and communicating those to school for each Friday of the Read-a-Thon
- We are challenging Herons Crossing School in Airdrie during our Read-a-Thon
- And, although it doesn't count toward the Read-a-Thon Minutes officially, Fireside's staff are keeping track of their own reading minutes to show off alongside students; they have also challenged the Herons Crossing Staff for the most minutes read.

UPDATED: School Council Meeting Wednesday, February 2

Constable Nathan Moore, RCMP Officer and School Resource and Community Liaison, will be presenting about basic Online Safety. It will be similar to the one students are engaging in class. His role with the Cochrane detachment is primarily as School Resource and Community Liaison; he is also one of the three Forensic Sketch Artists in the Province for the RCMP. NEW: Grade 2 Igaluit Day!

On Thursday, all grade 2 classes engaged in a Celebration of Learning for the end of their Social Studies unit studying Iqaluit in Nunavut. For their final projects, students built Inukshuks in the area beside the bus lane; you can see their beautiful and creative work in the outside school space along the bus lane beside the school if you're walking by the school. Students also built Igloos out of marshmallows and made Inukshuk trading cards. Making Arctic animals out of clay and using repurposed items to make little Indigenous-style drums were the finale of the day. Students completed their final journal reflections today to share their thinking about what they learned in doing these activities, which they've learned about in their class unit.







UPDATED: January 27th was Family Literacy Day

Did you know that Thursday, January 27th was Family Literacy Day? As our Read-a-Thon started yesterday, we thought we would leave these 12 questions you could discuss and explore with your student(s) when they're reading or you're reading together at home:

- 1. Could this story be true? Why or why not?
- 2. Where is the setting of this story?
- 3. Who is this story about? Tell me what you know from the book about him or her or them.
- 4. What words would you use to describe the main character? Why?
- 5. Do you like the main character? Why or why not?
- 6. Does the main character have a problem? What is it?
- 7. How is the problem solved? (What is the solution?)
- 8. What is the scariest, funniest, saddest, most interesting, or most funny part of the story? Read it aloud.
- 9. Do you like this story? Why or why not?
- 10. Do you know any real people who are like the characters in this story? Who are the people and how are they similar or different?
- 11. Would you like to be a character from the story? Why or why not?
- 12. Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?


REMINDER: Daily Health Checklist Usage
