# **NEW: Pink Shirt Day**

The Grade 3 leadership groups are very excited to be hosting Pink Shirt Day at Fireside this year on Thursday, February 17th. They will participate in spreading positive messages and energy through the activities they've created for Fireside School. There will be a few lead up activities occurring as well.

Pink Shirt Day is about working together to stop bullying behaviour by celebrating diversity and promoting kindness and inclusivity. It's about creating a community where all people feel safe, valued, and respected. Pink Shirt Day began in 2007 when a student in Nova Scotia was bullied for

wearing a pink shirt to school and has since been recognized annually as a day to stand against bullying. It will officially take place Feb. 23, which is a vacation day for RVS schools. Instead, many schools will observe Pink Shirt Day during the week of Feb. 14-18. In addition to encouraging students and staff to wear pink, schools are planning a variety of events and activities to promote kindness including art projects, random acts of kindness and participation in virtual events and seminars.

# **NEW: Parent Education Sessions in partnership with Community Education Services**

**09 FEB 2022** - 10:00 AM - Noon: **Brain Science: Sciences of Hope and Resilience \*\*\*please register using the poster link only\*\*\*** This session exists to support caregivers with the fundamental elements of brain science with a focus on the strengths of knowing how this can positively impact children and youth development. The interactive session will provide insight into brain structure and the stress response. In addition, we will explore adverse childhood experiences and Covid-19 as they relate to brain development, while providing information and strategies to build resilience. <u>Poster</u>

**16 FEB 2022** - 6:00 PM - 8:00 PM: **Managing Anxiety in Youth within the COVID-19 World \*\*\*please register using the poster link only\*\*\*** This session will outline the differences among worry, stress, and anxiety, and how the COVID-19 pandemic may affect mental health and wellness in teens. The session will also cover clinical presentations of anxiety and provide parents with insight as to what is 'normal' and when to seek help from a mental health professional. The session will also cover strategies for parents to assist their youth in navigating this complex world, including stress management, self-care, and strategies for improving executive functioning and resilience. <u>Poster</u>

This session will provide individuals with information about the benefits of play, exploration, and adventure for supporting positive mental health. # **Community Therapy Dogs are now part of our Fireside School Community**

Listening/Caring Tails is a Rocky View Schools approved program designed to help children increase their comfort and confidence by reading out loud (Listening Tails) to therapy dogs. The therapeutic help provided by our dogs is tailor-made to fit each situation, with the common theme that dogs provide a level of comfort that only they can (Caring Tails).

At all times, dogs in this program are on leash and supervised. The success of the program stems from the fact that dogs love the attention they receive from children being with them and are non-judgemental listeners (Listening Tails). They also have a calming, relaxing effect on those who are having a problem self-regulating (Caring Tails).



Fireside presently has two dogs involved in the Listening/Caring Tails programs. The participating dogs are Daisy (Ms. Amy Stark's), who will be based in the Learning Support Centre and Ms. Stark's Kindergarten classroom and Chewy (Mr. Shaun Perratt), who will be based in Mr. Perratt's class. The dogs participating in this program have been trained, temperament assessed and health checked in order to join.

# **REMINDER: Recess/Lunch Activities**

We are adding more activities for students to enjoy during unstructured times. Upper grades will have the opportunity to play board games and enter a ping pong league at lunch time. Lower grades will get to enjoy activities and games led by some of the older students.
