NEW: Hands-On Numeracy

Students across all grades have opportunities to develop their functional numeracy skills using a variety of methods and ways of representing numbers. Manipulative tools, like these Cuisenaire Rods that Mrs. Cooledge's Grade 2s played with, help students to represent numbers concretely. This helps them make connections between their natural counting sense and the symbols (digits) we use to communicate numbers. They stimulate deep thinking and careful reasoning as they create and solve one another's questions.



We look forward to sharing the prize recipients in next week's Focus!


NEW: Ms. Weintz's Grade 1 Artists

UPDATED: Submitting Pledged Funds for Read-a-Thon

Now that students have collected pledges, it is time to submit those funds to the school. Please note that Fireside School does not accept cash.

1. Log into your *School Cash Online* account, then choose the "Make A Donation" bar.

*A receipt will be emailed to you.

*If there are sponsors who are still interested in making a one-time donation, please have them do so before Monday, March 7, 2022.

2. Wait for the pledged amount to be added to your child's *School Cash Online* account. (*Please note: Amounts for payment should appear starting Tuesday, March 8, 2022, depending on form submission.*)

*Based on the student's submitted Read-A-Thon sponsor log, a catalogue item will be created for you to purchase that reflects your child's total pledges.
