#### **UPDATED:** Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) at Fireside

Grade 6 students at Fireside School will be writing Provincial Achievement Tests in May and June 2022 for this school year. In the coming months, Grade 6 teachers will continue their work with students around how best to engage and prepare for these assessments, including engagement of practice PAT assessments and reviews of assessment-taking strategies and skills.

For your reference, here are the dates for schools for Fireside students:

- Wednesday, May 18, 2022: Grade 6 English Language Arts Part A (Written)
- Wednesday, June 15, 2022: Grade 6 English Language Arts Part B (Reading Comprehension)
- Friday, June 17, 2022: Grade 6 Mathematics Part A (Numerical Response)
- Monday, June 20, 2022: Grade 6 Mathematics Part B (Multiple-Choice)
- Wednesday, June 22, 2022: Grade 6 Science
- Thursday, June 23, 2022: Grade 6 Social Studies

Parents and families can find further information on Alberta's Provincial Testing in the <u>Grade 6</u> <u>Parent Guide, 2021-2022</u>, including Testing Descriptions and Sample Questions. Further details about PAT's for our school specifically will be coming out to parents and families over the next few months in class communications and through future editions of the *Fireside Focus*.

#### **Reminder: Healthy Hunger Returns**

Early in the school year, with the support of volunteers, Fireside School Council put in place a lunch program called "Healthy Hunger," which allowed families to purchase a lunch for their students at a local vendor once a month. The local vendor would then deliver the lunches to the school, and a group of volunteers would distribute these meals.

In February, "Fun Lunch" was put on-hold by Fireside School Administration, as we evaluated the equity of the program. After consultation with stakeholders, we have come up with a potential solution to ensure that all children at the school can take part in this program, if families choose to do so, while not relying on school funds. Healthy Hunger has now put an option at the bottom of the

menu so that, in addition to ordering a meal, families can choose to donate a meal. The funds from the donated meals will then be used to support the purchase of extra meals.

The next "Fun Lunch" will be on Thursday, April 28<sup>th</sup> and will be Subway. Please contact the school at fireside@rockyview.ab.ca by Thursday, April 14, to confirm if you do **not** wish to participate in "Fun Lunch". If you have not contacted the school to let us know that you are choosing not to participate in "Fun Lunch" this month, there will be extra sandwiches available for those students whose families might have forgotten to order or did not place an order for any reason.

If the need for donated lunches is greater than the amount of money received, The Friends of Fireside Society is willing to support the difference on this one occasion. If there is an excess of donated money, a discussion will occur at School Council to determine a use for it.

We are going to try out this new method for April's "Fun Lunch" to see how it works and re-evaluate afterwards.


