


Hello, families and friends of Fireside! It has been a busy and bustling week at Fireside School!

NEW: PE at Fireside

Phys. Ed. Classes have been finishing their November units this week at Fireside. For our grade 1-4 students, they are finishing up with Target Games, Skipping, Rock Climbing, and "I Love a Challenge". "I Love a Challenge" is a series of 40 video challenges to foster a growth mindset and a love of physical literacy. Ask your child what their favourite "I Love a Challenge" was and what level they achieved. Our grade 5-6 students learned how to juggle and worked hard to set a goal to master 2 or 3 ball juggling. Our grade 7's and 8's finished up their basketball unit, as well as rock climbing and skipping. For warm-ups, the 7 and 8's worked to get their heart rates up by dancing. Ask your child how to do the "Cotton Eye Joe" -- it was a favourite!!

NEW: Fireside School Nutrition Program Update

Fireside's School Nutrition Program has had some changes that we wish to bring to your attention. However, what is still the same is that food is available for students who've forgotten their lunch or snacks or for those who need school to supply a lunch (no questions asked).

For lunch: students are able to access a brown bag lunch during the lunch hour from the Servedy, which is located beside the gym, just off the Learning Commons. Ms. Michaud is there to help students get lunch at that time.

Healthy snacks and fruit will still be available in the main office, the Roost, Learning Support classrooms, and CDA offices.

NEW: RCMP Visit to Grade 7

Mid-November, Ms. Clark went to Grade 7 Health Classes for presentations and discussions centred around our words having power. The intention was to help students identify and use respectful language with their peers and understand that negative word choice can have negative impacts. As an extension to these discussions and activities, Constable Nathan Moore visited our Grade 7 Health classes on



November 25th, during their LA and Social Studies blocks with Ms. Simpson. Constable Moore continued the conversation, also focusing on cyber-bullying and safe, appropriate behaviour on social media.

NEW: Grade 1 this week

Grade 1's have started talking about the needs of plants and animals, including that cardinals migrate in the winter and that birch trees thrive in cold environments. Grade 1 classes have also had fun looking at the activities they do as families, especially during the winter. It is great to see their work decorating the grade 1 hall!





Lunch Bell Time Revision

Please note that we have made a minor adjustment to our lunch schedule. Lunch times for each grade now operate as follows:

- 11:35-11:55 – Lunch for grades 5-8 (grades 1-4 recess)
- 11:55-12:15 – Lunch for grades 1-4 (grades 5-8 recess)

Fireside School is a closed campus and, as such, students may not leave the premises unless we have confirmation that they are going home every day for lunch. If you have not done so already, confirmation can be completed by emailing the office or a student's homeroom teacher to indicate that permission to leave for lunch time each day is confirmed. When students are going home for lunch, they would return to school at 12:15 p.m. to go to afternoon classes.
